RB Fire Station 33 Renovation Project

The project seeks to increase public awareness of the station's deteriorating condition and to raise renovation funds. The renovation committee is an ad hoc committee of the Rancho Bernardo Community Council.

Built for a crew of three men and one engine, today three shifts of six crew members—men and women—are on duty and two engines and an ambulance are kept on site. The station's coverage area extends 28 square miles and the crew responds to more than 4,200 calls annually. Due to city budget constraints, the station has not been renovated, repairs have been deferred and the crew lives in cramped conditions. ("Fire Station No. 33 Project")
